<p>September Start of Year 11</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure students have the right equipment and that you help stress the importance of attending every day. • Ensure the college has correct parental contact details • Ensure you are signed up to Show My Homework and PiXL Independence
<p>October 11th October: Destinations Evening</p> <p>WB 15th October: Interim Report to Parents</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attend Destinations Evening and complete an application for UTC Warrington 6th Form: discuss next steps and aspirations with your son/daughter so they are clear what they are aiming for. • Discuss the report with your son/daughter – reward the positives and identify any areas for improvement. • Contact individual subject teachers if there are any concerns highlighted.
<p>November Thursday 22nd November Parents Evening</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make appointments to see your son/daughter’s individual subject teachers. • Write a revision timetable with your son/daughter and offer them incentives to stick to it
<p>December WB 26th November Pre Public Exams begin</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talk through the examination timetable and help your son/daughter to organise their time during the examination weeks. • Be aware that your son/daughter will be under pressure during these weeks and try to provide a quiet place to study at home where possible.
<p>January WB 7th January Pre Public Exam Results Day</p> <p>9th-11th January OCR Examinations in Engineering/Business and ICT</p> <p>WB 21st January Full Report to Parents</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss your son/daughter’s results with them and help them to identify key subjects for improvement. • Contact individual subject teachers if you have any concerns about particular subjects/require more support. • Display your son/daughter’s examination timetable in a prominent place at home and discuss with them each night the exams they have the next day. • Make sure their day to day arrangements for getting to and from school are organised and failsafe. • Discuss the report with your son/daughter – reward the positives and identify any areas for improvement. • Contact individual subject teachers if there are any concerns highlighted.

<p>February</p> <p>Targeted Parents Evening Appointments</p> <p>SLT Interviews Week Beginning : 11th February</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If you have particular concerns remaining about a key subject make an appointment to see staff at our dedicated Year 11 targeted Parents Evening. • Be aware that a member of the senior Leadership team will be holding a one to one meeting with your son/daughter this week to make sure they are on track and clear about their next steps/destination Post 16. • Discuss this with your son/daughter and reinforce the importance of this at home.
<p>March</p> <p>WB 4th March</p> <p>Pre Public Exams</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talk through the examination timetable and help your son/daughter to organise their time during the examination weeks. • Be aware that your son/daughter will be under pressure during these weeks and try to provide a quiet place to study at home where possible.
<p>April</p> <p>WB 1st April</p> <p>Reports to parents issued with Final examination Timetables and arrangements</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss your son/daughter's results with them and help them to identify key subjects for improvement. Be aware that this is the last practice opportunity they will have before the real thing. • Contact individual subject teachers if you have any concerns about particular subjects/require more support.
<p>May/ June</p> <p>Final Exam preparation and commencement</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Display your son/daughter's examination timetable in a prominent place at home and discuss with them each night the exams they have the next day. • Make sure their day to day arrangements for getting to and from school are organised and failsafe. • Feed and water them well! • Incentivise and support them for this 'last push'. Reinforce with us the message that this is extremely important but relatively short in the scheme of their whole lives.
<p>August</p> <p>Thursday 22nd August</p> <p>Results Day 9am</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Come to college to celebrate and be proud with us at all your son/daughter has achieved! • Discuss with our staff next steps and options for sixth Form at UTC Warrington.
